

We like to call ourselves a camp in the summer and a mentoring program during the school year. Our Seeds of HOPE Mentoring program matches students of all ages from Saranac Community Schools with trained and screened Mentors to meet One on One, One hour, Once a week at school during school hours.

We are rebooting Seeds of HOPE Mentoring. During our Sabbatical we did not have insurance to facilitate the program safely and then during Covid we were not able to get into the school. We are fully insured and the doors are reopened to us now, we plan to have mentors and students back together early 2022.

We have mentored over 50 students since 2011 and so thankful we get to resume.

We asked that if camp was to come to an end that He would make that clear to us and if it was to continue that the new location would "Wow" us. Then Caroline was at a basketball game sitting next to her friend Diana Whorley Naylor and got to talking about the future of camp. Diana told Caroline, "Oh, you need to talk to my Dad." Caroline's Mom and Diana's Dad had grown up together in Ionia, so there was already that connection.

During a little reprieve in the pandemic this past summer of 2021, He revived Day Camp at Camp Victory and Worship Camp at Pathway a Wesleyan Church.
